## O-Section AT Responsibilities and Trails and Shelters Maintenance

In 2012 the O-Section took over the AT maintenance from the Dartmouth Outings Club, covering the stretch from Ledyard Bridge at the Connecticut to Rte. 12 in Woodstock, doubling our trail responsibility to 46 miles. The expanded task called for new managing concepts: with the help of the main club we assigned 2 mile (average) trail segments to individual adopters.

*Lee Eastman*, our Trails and Shelters Maintenance Coordinator, took charge of assessing trail. He arranged for O-Section volunteers or GMC Waterbury trail crews to help with larger projects or chain saw work that could not be handled by the respective adopter. A big job, indeed, and Lee spent lots of time on coordinating jobs and going out himself to quickly take care of a new trail emergency. For example, he helped *Inge Brown* with a weed trimmer to clear the prolific growth under the Thundering Falls board walk, putting in many hours of work.

When Lee had to resign his job due to back problems (he had a successful operation since), *Inge Brown* assembled a task force to look at our trail maintenance experience during the last three years, and see where we can improve. Here is our new trail maintenance concept: We've divided our AT section into three equal, about 15 miles stretches, assigning them to new coordinators as follows:

We are still using adopters (altogether 24) for routine trail and shelters maintenance. We encourage adopters to contact us if they need help or assistance keeping up with basic maintenance if a planned vacation or illness keeps you off the trail temporarily.

Based on own observations and reports from club members and adopters, Trail Coordinators will assess the need for trail work beyond routine maintenance by the adopters. If necessary, they will contact club volunteers for help with chain saws and other equipment, and/or secure trail crew help from headquarters.

Trail Coordinators will communicate with GMC trail management (Dave Hardy and the Membership and Volunteer Coordinator).

Trail Coordinators will receive and handle adopter reports and inform O-Sec leadership and members on trail conditions and work done during the year.

As in the past, the O-Section will schedule two or three hike/workdays per year to keep members familiar with the trail, and <u>do specific trail projects</u> as identified by the Trail Coordinators.

We hope that these new arrangements will improve our trail maintenance while keeping the Trail Coordinators' job at a manageable level.

## **REFLECTIONS ON A LOCAL TRAIL SYSTEM**

## "Driving to and from an Outing should not take more time than the event itself".

If you follow that self-imposed rule, exploring local trails makes a lot of sense.

We recently chose to hike again on different sections of the Rivendell Trail, a real treasure of 38 miles between Flagpole Hill (2200') in VT and Mt. Cube in NH. It snakes its way along roads and skid trails, up steep hills to inviting view points, traverses overgrown clear cuts and rocky ridges, and winds through long stretches of very lonesome woods.

Since it also crosses several country roads, you can do roundtrip hikes as short as1.2 or 6.6 miles. With car spotting, longer linear options are possible.

Trying to follow the sometimes elusive blue

blazes, and kicking and clipping branches out of the way, we soon realized that maintaining a marked trail is at least as difficult as creating it. A major storm or a change in property lines can alter the planned course considerably. While clearing help is always needed, even using a trail contributes to its maintenance. See for yourself! We have scheduled five trips on the Rivendell Trail: Sept.12 Flagpole Hill

- Sept 19 Sunday Mountain
- Oct. 3 Rivendell and Echo Mountain Trail
- Oct. 25 Parker Road to West Fairlee
