NAME CHANGE COMMITTEE

The Name Change Committee, made up of *Iris Berezin*-chair, *Kathy Astrauckas*, *Peter Hope, Nick Krembs*, *Lynne Miller* and *Heinz Trebitz*, was formed following the last Annual Meeting, with the charge to

"Consider the advisability of a change to the name of the Section, taking into account any comments from Section members, and to report its findings at the next annual meeting of the Section; and, if the committee judges a change might be beneficial, to propose one or more new names at the next annual meeting of the Section".

The **early direction** of the committee has been to explore ways of **improving our visibility** rather than focusing specifically on the name of the Section. To that end we have identified and started a number of activities:

Communicating with GMC headquarters about improving their website,

Optimizing our website and our website search engine,

Collecting demographic information about our membership.

Expanding our use of social media (Facebook),

Posting outings on the Upper Valley Listserv, in neighboring towns and the UV Daily; Using email lists to post outings,

Contacting weekly newspapers in local towns about how to post outing. Exploring the possibility of identifying our section of the Appalachian Trail using signs bearing our name.

Collecting information from outing leaders regarding how non-members found out about the outing.

BOOTS TO BOATS - THE NEXT CHAPTER

Last year's "Boots to Boats" collaboration with Marsh-Billings-Rockefeller National Historical Park was so successful that the **program will be repeated** this summer and fall. The Ottauquechee Section will again co-lead short to moderate length hikes on the Appalachian Trail between Woodstock and Norwich with rangers from the National Park. These hikes are particularly good for beginners and families, because the pace is relaxed and will include stops at points of interest.

The Park Service plans to arrange a shuttle bus to and from the trailhead, eliminating the need to carpool. The section will also co-lead a beginner's trail maintenance outing with the National Park Service on the Appalachian Trail on Quimby Mountain in Killington.

Outings Coordinator Kathy Astrauckas will contact possible leaders soon to start scheduling the hikes. (Planning meeting for summer outings is March 14). So far the dates are: June 17; July 1, 15, 29; Aug. 12; Sept. 2, 16, 30. The program will culminate with a "Peak to Peak" event, probably on Oct. 14. Feel free to contact Kathy before the planning meeting to secure your preferred dates and hikes.
