## INGE BROWN (3/3/1934 - 8/1/2025)

A very personal remembering.



*Inge Brown* left us – on her own terms – the way she lived.

I happened to visit her the day she started voluntary cessation of eating and drinking (VCED) to end her life under Hospice care. "I had a good life" she said, "but the more interesting part was before I joined the O-Section". Well, I did not know her then. All I remember are the last thirty years with Inge in the Green Mountain Club. She came into our lives in December 1995 by crashing the Trebitz' New Year's Eve Party, showing unannounced as a friend of the Janeways. During the following years she made up for it by offering countless celebrations, parties dinners. invitations at her house, always with a spread of lots of delicious food, beautifully arranged. Inge was an excellent cook and loved to entertain. With her wide-ranging interests in opera, music, ballroom dancing, foreign countries, travel, crop lines, Osher classes, - friends and acquaintances from all over the world enjoyed her hospitality. On the home ground, she joined and led bike rides and short hikes, often coming up with new trails

or venues, and helped on workdays. From 2008 to 2015 she was President of our O-Section.

With the troubles of getting older, Inge had to give up some of her beloved activities, like downhill skiing, dancing, sailing, even biking, but she never complained. She stayed her independent feisty self, always conscious of her appearance, sometimes a bit bossy (I called her the General) but always generous, cheerful and optimistic.
